SUBJECT: ISR Modifies Helmet Rules for 2021-2022 Season

Orange Rule and camera use addressed

**Eagle River, Wis.** ~ (April 27, 2021) International Snowmobile Racing (ISR) recently held it's annual rule meetings with the affiliates and manufacturers to finalize the sports rules and regulations for the upcoming race season.

The ISR, in agreement with its affiliate who made ISR aware of the situation, and we will be implementing a pair of rule changes regarding helmet usage starting with the 2021-2022 schedule.

Moving forward, the ISR will continue to strongly encourage all drivers in all disciplines / divisions to source helmets that continue to display High Vis Colors/Orange that cover 75% for oval racing and 50% for SnoCross to prevent possible driver injuries during competitive events.

The change affects the long-standing "Orange" Rule, which made the above mandatory. ISR has removed the mandatory language and penalties, instead relying on competitors to use their own judgement when modifying helmets for protection and durability as it pertains to the use of High Vis/Orange colors.

In addition to that change, the ISR will no longer allow any camera or digital acquisition devises to be attached to any driver's helmet. This will be in effect anytime a race vehicle is on the track, whether it be a test, practice session, or in competition.
